A Journey Through 1857: The First War of Independence

The auditorium was filled with a sense of expectation as Class 7 and 8 students were called to a special session on 1857 - The First War of Independence. Eyes were bright with excitement, for they were all about to take a journey back in time and see the tales of bravery that would define India's struggle for independence. And leading them on this historical voyage was the very impassioned speaker Mr. Mohan Shete whose words bore the weight of history itself. As he began narrating the tales of our brave warriors- Tatya Tope, Rani Laxmi Bai, Nanasahab Peshwe- the room fell silent. Every word he spoke painted vivid pictures in the young minds, making history come alive. The students could almost see Rani Laxmi Bai galloping on her horse, sword in hand, fearless and determined to protect her motherland. They could feel the fire in Bhagat Singh's heart as he stood firm against British oppression.

To enhance the session, Mr. Shete recited a soul-stirring poem on Rani Laxmi Bai, a composition that echoed the courage and undying spirit of the warrior queen. The words echoed in the room, filling the hearts of the students with pride and patriotism. They held on to every verse, enthralled by the rhythm of bravery woven into the poem. It was not just a session; it was an experience-one that made them feel the weight of sacrifices made for their freedom.

However, it was the interactive discussion after that really made the session memorable. Students participated eagerly, asking questions, voicing thoughts, and extolling the virtues of these 1857 warriors. The stories must have reached a chord within them, as these are freedom fighters, and they were sure to be respected. At the end of the session, they were taking home with them something much more profound than knowledge- the deep feeling of gratitude and inspiration. Mr. Mohan Shete had not taught them history but made them live it. In that moment, every young heart had flames of patriotism burning a little brighter.





Mapping the Marathas: Exploring the Legacy of Forts through Interactive Maps

History is not a mere recalling dates and events- it is a vivid experience of past, landscapes of battles, tracing the steps of legendary warriors. This very history came alive with the interactive session handled by Mr. Advait Kulkarni and Mr. Aditya Tekale, wherein the students and their educators undertook an intriguing travel through maps, forts, and the brilliant tactics of great kings.

A truly breathtaking view into the perspective it opened - a video of the grandness of the universe - led the students through a marvelous revelation of just how small our Earth is. But this view of the cosmos, though related to astronomy, gave way to how geography impacts civilization and conquests.

From the cosmos, the focus shifted to Earth, zooming into the legendary forts of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj. Through interactive 3D maps, the students explored the rugged terrain, the high walls, the secret passages, and the strategic positioning of these forts. Each fort told a story - not just of war and defense but of vision, intelligence, and foresight. The session emphasized how these modern mapping tools can revolutionize teaching methodologies, making history more engaging and immersive for the students. But it did not end with the Marathas. The session was extended into the glorious past of the Chola Dynasty, the Mauryan Empire, and the great movements of South Indian kingdoms. Maps were used by the speakers to show how these empires rose, spread, and conquered other areas. The use of maps made students see history unfold before their eyes and therefore more meaningful than reading it in books.

The climax of the session was a gripping video on the Battle of Palkhed (1728 AD), where Bajirao Peshwa defeated the Mughals using geographical strategy to his advantage. This battle, often cited as a masterclass in warfare tactics, became even more fascinating when linked with real-time maps, showing exactly how Bajirao maneuvered his forces. The students were captivated, realizing how geography is not just about places—it is about power, strategy, and survival.

The session ended with an interactive discussion where questions were asked, ideas shared, and explored the possibility of these digital mapping tools changing history lessons in classrooms. It was a revelation for teachers, an opportunity to bring history lessons to life in ways never before conceived.

As the session ended, one thing was clear: history is not just about the past—it is about discovering new ways to connect with it. And thanks to Mr. Advait Kulkarni and Mr. Aditya Tekale, the students walked away with not just knowledge, but a new perspective on history itself. Burned a little brighter in every young heart.

Uncovering the Secrets of the Earth: Exploring Layers of Soil, Weathering, and Erosion



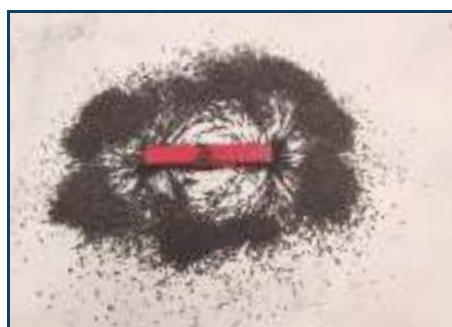

In today's interconnected world, the boundaries between subjects are becoming increasingly blurred. To prepare students for the complexities of the 21st century, educators must adopt innovative approaches to teaching and learning. Therefore, a workshop was arranged for teachers in PGKM School, on 4th January 2025 which was conducted by John Naugaria from Black Swan.

Subject integration, also known as interdisciplinary learning, offers a powerful solution. By connecting different subjects together, educators can foster deeper understanding, increase engagement and develop critical thinking skills. There are many benefits of Subject Integration like Deeper Understanding, Increased Engagement, Critical Thinking etc. Sir introduced teachers to 8 multiple Intelligence and it is said that each child is capable of at least 1 multiple Intelligence.



Case Study: Implementing Subject Integration in the Classroom

Example: Chips Packet Data

A Science teacher teaches about the nutritional value of the chips, including the breakdown of macronutrients (carbohydrates, proteins, and fats) and micronutrients (vitamins and minerals).

An English teacher discusses the importance of a balanced diet and the potential health effects of excessive junk food consumption. Assigns an article writing task or a debate on the topic of junk food.

A Social Science teacher explores the historical and cultural significance of potatoes through the usage of map and so on.

A Math teacher analyses the nutritional data on the chips packet, calculating the percentage of carbohydrates, fats, and other nutrients. Students learn to interpret and visualize data, using mathematical concepts such as ratios, proportions, and percentages.

This example illustrates how subject integration can facilitate a richer, more nuanced learning experience, as students explore a single topic from multiple disciplinary perspectives. Overall it was an incredibly insightful session! Teachers gained a deeper understanding of how to effectively integrate multiple subjects in the classroom, creating a more holistic and engaging learning experience for their students.

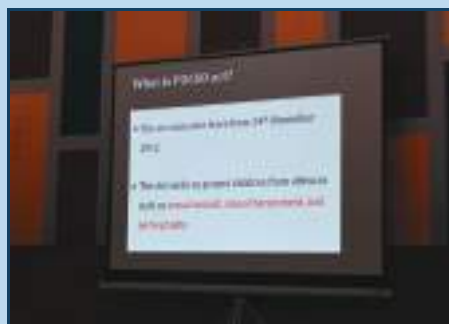
